<p>Increase awareness and reporting of hate incidents</p>	<p><b>Short Term:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Invite attendees able to contribute to delivery against this problem:</li> </ul> <p><b>Long Term:</b> Deliverables from the Hate Crime conference:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Could the CLASP concept be expanded? (CLASP - Camden LGBT Advice and Safety Project, is a safe haven project run by Camden Lesbian Gay Bisexual and Transgender Forum)</li> <li>• Increase &amp; improve third-party reporting. (Third party reporting sites are places where people can go to report hate crime, anonymously or not. These organisations will report incidents to the police only with the consent of the victim).</li> <li>• Develop further work around restorative approaches and education.</li> <li>• An app for reporting hate crime</li> <li>• Conversation with 3rd party reporting sites about what is being recorded and reported to improve consistency</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Increased reporting of hate incidents</li> </ul>

<p>Increase community networks</p>	<p><b>Short Term:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Invite attendees who are able to contribute to delivery against this problem:</li> <li>• Measure the increase in partnership networks influenced by attendees reaching out to other groups in 2015/16</li> </ul> <p><b>Long Term:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Think about communications following a major incident or cohesion issue e.g.: Sydney "Ride with Me", (where Australians are offering to commute to work with their Muslim neighbours)</li> <li>• Consider asking attendees whether new networks have been created via a questionnaire</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Evidence increased number of networks created through the Community Safety Partnership activity</li> </ul>
