

The co-chairs **Andrew Reece** and **Stuart Dunn** welcomed everyone to the meeting





## CLDS updates from the last meeting




Head OT Rebecca Mason, will be back from maternity leave in March

 they have written to all GPs telling them they are doing well but can do better




 they told GPs to contact Courtney if they need help - and reminded GPs they get a payment for each health check completed

give more support to carers




offer more advocacy training









Things that are good about floating support include



 it builds people's confidence and helps them socially



• it means you can do more things in the community



people get good support to travel to and do activities



Things that could be better about Floating Support include



 workers are not paid enough so it is hard to find and keep the best staff



there is no time for planning changes and goals



 people do not always know who will be supporting them and when they are coming



How floating support should make someone's life better



 workers should remember a person's goals and use the What Matters plan



 more hours would mean more choices for people hours should be more flexible



 having the same worker each time is helps the person feel comfortable and get the outcomes they want

Synergy are looking for 1 new person to join the group


There needs to be more diversity in the group – it's important to include people with different needs

there should be more people with LD in the groups




 it's not always easy to say what you want in larger groups – smaller groups are a place to be heard



• the Council photo ID scheme




use a freedom pass



use a citizen card




or ask for a postal vote
