

The CQC will look at certain areas of our service including

transitioning from CYPD to CLDS



the importance of having a named worker



and the First Contact duty system



The CQC will look at these areas and point out the good things and where we can do better



There will be some new staff to support people with LD into work



A small care home is being set up in Camden for when people need an emergency place to go



We need to do this because Breakaway is being used for short placements and carers aren't getting a break if they need one



In the last year nearly every person with an LD and a Camden GP, has had an Annual Health Check



This is a big increase from the year before and Courtney Francis has worked very hard to make this happen



Next year Courtney wants to focus on making sure everyone has a proper Health Action Plan


We will share the CLDS Annual Report at the next PT meeting - the main priorities will be to

The 3 Pillars Model is a way of thinking about working with people with a LD




We looked at the leaflet from the psychology team – the leaflet is for people with a LD and people supporting them




We were asked for feedback

It's important everyone in Camden uses the same form



The passport is for when you go to a planned hospital appointment or if you go to accident and emergency



It is important to have one - keep it updated if you go to the GP and things change



The passport we use is only for Camden - but we hope to work with NHS England on a national one



There is a list of people who can support you to fill out the passport in Lynette's presentation on the

Planning Together website



If you don't have a hospital passport Courtney can come to group sessions to support people with filling them out



You can print your hospital passport or have it on your phone – or your support worker's phone



You can also send your passport to the LD liaison nurses and they will keep a copy

If you don't think staff are reading your passport speak to the LD liaison nurse – if the nurse is not there, speak to the Safeguarding Lead



A daisy symbol can be put on your headboard so staff know there is extra information to read



There are different types of passports – Camden are only using the Hospital Passport and the Health Action Plan



Hospital Passports can be used from age **14** - it would be good to remind people and school nurses

Katy from Camden Carers runs the Family Members Reference Group - this is a group of carers for people with LD and autism




Here are their updates

Making Carers Count



Anna Campbell is a Community Engagement Project Manager at Camden Carers

We want to focus our support on carers not usually included - we looked at carers using our service and information about the people living in Camden



Some ethnic groups have a lot of residents in Camden but don't use our service much – these are people who are Chinese, Somali and Bengali



We think this group of people is where the greatest need is - we are trying to work with other groups and hope there will be benefits for several ethnic communities



We do things in Greenwood and online – we also run activities across Camden



We can email you a leaflet for the parents group – there is also an online video



Synergy Role play



Jill said they did a role play because some of the posters at Greenwood have lots of colours and white writing - people with LD can't read this



Small group discussion



The groups talked about

 how to make sure information is easy to understand



how to get better at working with diverse groups



 things being done that matter and are open to people from minority groups



Comments included

 use things like Google – you can use the microphone or speaker and let it speak for you





- sometimes there are 2 versions of a document –
 information should be shared in the easiest way to
 understand way, so it is clear for people with LD
 and English as a second language
- wall posters should be clearer



online links on posters and QR codes can be tricky
 use videos instead of leaflets when possible



 there could be a focus group of people with LD or autism that looks at posters or leaflets before they go out



 with the focus group they should think of what reason there is for taking part – it's not just about getting vouchers



 communication needs to work for everyone - the hub should be accessible to all



 Camden's Easier Info service can help and is free to anyone working in Camden Council

Sometimes it happens lots of times, like bullying




Trauma can affect your mental health and how you work with other people
