You said, we did:



How we are using your feedback to improve your area.

You said: You said you wanted to feel safer in your area and were concerned about antisocial behaviour including noise complaints, vandalism and intimidation.

We did: Our new responsive security patrol team (previously

known as housing patrol) is taking a new approach to how we support you to feel safe in your home. We have extended the hours of the service to run from 4pm to 3am, seven days a week.

The team wear high visibility vests and carry out foot patrols wearing body cameras that can be used for evidence if needed by the police. Working with our colleagues in community safety, we are identifying crime and antisocial behaviour hotspots, and these areas will have extra patrols to gather evidence and intelligence to support the police. We have added another vehicle to the patrol so that they can get

around the borough more quickly and respond to incidents, and all patrol vehicles now have CCTV dashboard cameras.

Homes for those with a Camden connection

We've launched a new type of housing to help those who live and work in Camden.

Our Camden Living homes allow teachers, nurses and others earning around £30,000 to £40,000 to afford to rent in Camden. They're our way of helping people who do not qualify for a council home and also struggle to afford the cost of private renting.

Tenants have been granted three year tenancies in 65 homes at Maiden Lane, Bourne Estate and Chester Balmore.

We know that the grown up children of our tenants are struggling to afford to move out of their family homes so we've

given homes to those from council and housing association tenants too. Twelve of the new tenants are moving from overcrowded family homes.

All of our homes have now been let, but more will become available. **Register your interest for news and updates at camdenliving.co.uk**

Camden Fund is open for applications

Tenants and residents' associations, community groups and businesses directly affected by HS2 plans can now apply for grants from a new £3.5 million two-year fund the council has secured from High Speed 2 (HS2) Ltd.

The HS2 Camden Fund is being delivered through Camden Giving and funding will be awarded to projects that strengthen a sense of place, support community cohesion and alleviate some of the disruption to communities caused by construction of the high speed railway. There are two levels of funding available – small grants from £1,000 to £10,000

and larger funds from £10,001 to £100,000.

This is a great opportunity for TRAs to put forward projects that will support your residents and communities during a challenging time.

Priority will be given to projects that support residents living in areas most affected by HS2 works. These include Regents Park, Somers Town, the area around Mornington Crescent and parts of Primrose Hill.

Investment near you

As part of our fire safety programme we are carrying out fire safety work on 1,218 homes in Camden Town in areas such as Amphil Estate, College Place, Georgina Street and Albert Street.

This includes fitting new flat and communal doors, fire alarms, fire stopping, signage and redecorating communal areas with flame resistant paint.

One hundred and two homes at Walker House will benefit from newly refurbished lifts, communal heating works at Monica Shaw Court are progressing well and we will soon be starting work on new communal heating work at Cecil Rhodes and the Chenies.

Investing in Somers Town

Somers Town is one of the areas receiving funding through the Community Investment Programme.

Through the funding there will be a new community hall at Coopers Lane, new public spaces and 44 new council homes reserved for local people.

The Community Investment Programme is also funding the new building at Edith Neville Primary School, which will provide modern facilities to help local children get the best start in life. We hope to inspire and encourage Somers Town residents to access all Camden has to offer by improving education opportunities and maintaining a sense of community.

We also want to keep the unique identity of each local area receiving Community Investment Programme funding, preserving diversity and ensuring Camden remains a place for everyone.

A colourful collaboration

The Greater London Authority (GLA) has partnered with the artist Stik, for MyMural, a project to encourage established artists to connect with residents by creating vibrant murals and colourful walls on estates and local buildings.

MyMural are looking for resident groups to join a pilot project collaborating with artists to add a pop of colour to their local environment, giving you an opportunity to improve your area with art.

At least one Camden resident group will be selected as part of the London-wide launch in 2018.

A new home for our town hall services

Plans to refurbish our 80-year-old town hall are underway.

Camden Town Hall will temporarily close in August 2018 and all services will relocate whilst the work takes place.

Birth and death registrations, duplicate certificate applications and citizenship ceremonies will be available from the Crowndale Centre, 218 Eversholt Street, NW1 1BD.

The council chamber and committee rooms for all council meetings will also move to the Crowndale Centre.

The nationality checking service, settlement checking service, nationality document return service, European passport return service and taking notices for marriages and civil partnerships, will be available from Tavistock House, Tavistock Square, WC1H 9JB.

We are currently renovating both locations. Tavistock House will have two new ceremony suites from August 2018, which are now available to book.

The town hall is scheduled to reopen in autumn 2021.
