Antrim Grove, NW3:

Outside nos. 335-341 Royal College Street – reduction in the operative hours of the loading bay to 10am – 4pm each day. Waiting and loading prohibitions will apply whenever the loading bay is not operative.

Herbal Hill, EC1R:

24-hour loading ban to be introduced along the west side of the street which falls within the London Borough of Camden.

STATEMENT OF REASONS


Antrim Grove, NW3:

The Council of the London Borough of Camden hereby gives notice that it proposes to make traffic orders under sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to change a 4.0m single yellow line into double yellow lines outside house number 4 Antrim Grove. This is to facilitate the ease of dropping off and picking up of residents at the Supported Living House. If the waiting restrictions change status is agreed to be implemented, this will result in no loss of surrounding resident's parking spaces.

Herbal Hill, EC1R:

Herbal Hill is a narrow street forming part of the boundary between the London Boroughs of Camden and Islington and through which CycleSuperHighway 6 is routed. The intention of the loading ban is to protect the passage of cyclists along the street.

- any reference in this order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;
- unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this order which is also used in the parent order shall have the same meaning as in that order.

- Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this order the parent order shall have effect as though;
- there was substituted for the items set out in relation to the similarly named streets in schedule 1 to the parent order, the items set out in table 1 of the schedule to this order;
