FERDINAND STREET / CHALK FARM ROAD JUNCTION – cyclists will be permitted to proceed straight ahead from Ferdinand Street into Juniper Crescent. The requirement to turn left from Ferdinand Street into Chalk Farm Road will continue to apply to all other vehicles.


STATEMENT OF REASONS

At present, all traffic is required to make a left turn from Ferdinand Street into Chalk Farm Road.

Due to major building development at the Morrison's supermarket site nearby, and in line with Camden's transport objectives to encourage take-up of cycling by providing safe and convenient routes, the island arrangement at this junction will be redesigned enabling cyclists to proceed ahead from Ferdinand Street into Juniper Crescent.

All other traffic will continue to be required to turn left at the junction and the rightturn ban will continue to apply to cycles.

The Council of the London Borough of Camden, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 [1984 c. 27], and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following order:

1. Citation and commencement

1.1 This order shall come into force on and may be cited as the Camden (Prescribed Routes) (No. 8) Traffic Order 2020.

2. Interpretation

- ^{2.1} In this order, the term "pedal cycle" has the same meaning ascribed to it by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 [S. I. 2016 No. 362].
- 2.2 Any reference in this order to any other order or enactment shall be construed as a reference to that order or enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent order or enactment.

3. Restrictions

- 3.1 Nothing in this article shall prejudice the validity of anything done or any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this order.
- 3.2 The Camden (Prescribed Routes) (No. 4) Traffic Order 1974 [G.L.C. 1974 No. 37] shall have effect as though Article 3 was omitted.
- 3.3 Every person causing any vehicle to proceed in Ferdinand Street shall cause that vehicle on reaching the junction with Chalk Farm Road to turn left.
- 3.4 Article 3.3 shall not apply in respect of pedal cycle being caused, on reaching the said junction, to proceed directly ahead into Juniper Crescent.

4. Exemptions

- 4.1 Nothing in this order shall apply;
- 4.1.1 in respect of anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform;
- 4.1.2 in relation to any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to Section 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
