Coming into force on 23 September 2023

The Council of the London Borough of Camden, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 [1984 c.27], and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:

1. Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as the Camden (Wilmot Place) (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1, 2023) Traffic Order 2023 and shall come into force on 23 September 2023.

2. Interpretation

- In this order the term "pedal cycle" has the same meaning as ascribed to it by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 [SI 2016/362].
- Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

3. Amendment or revocation of existing Orders

- Nothing in this Article shall prejudice the validity of anything done or any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order.
- The London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (St. Pancras) Regulations 1965 [SI 1965/227] shall have effect as though item 36 in Schedule 1 to those Regulations were omitted.
- The Camden (Wilmot Place) Experimental Traffic Order 2022 [LBC 2022/40] is hereby revoked.

4. Restrictions – prescribed routes

- No person shall cause any vehicle to turn left from Royal College Street into Jeffrey's Street.
- 4.2 No person shall cause any vehicle to turn left from Wilmot Place into Royal College Street.

5. Exemptions

- 5.1 Nothing in Article 4 shall apply in respect of;
- 5.1.1 a pedal cycle;
- 5.1.2 anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable or traffic warden in uniform;
- 5.1.3 a vehicle being used by the police, fire brigade or ambulance service;
- any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to Section 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
