Anya's Manifesto

- 1. I will close the gap between the rich and poor, the educated and uneducated in Camden.**
 - I will create a network between all the private schools and local state schools
 - The private schools will help fund meals and activities for the state schools
 - Programmes will be run so that kids in private and state schools can create friendships with one another
 - This will create a universal understanding of the issues that both sides of the equation face
 - It will also bring about opportunities for the youth, as a whole new world will be opened up for them.

- 2. I will focus on creating a strong support system for the youth in Camden to help solve the growing mental health crisis.**
 - I advocate to install a Camden Youth Hotline in our borough. This hotline will be open to anyone who doesn't feel safe in their environment:
 - who might be verbally abused at home or bullied at school
 - who is feeling insecure with their body image
 - who is feeling buried under the stress of school
 - who is feeling alone and needs someone to talk to
 - This hotline will be advertised in every school in Camden and will become a safe space for young people who need someone to talk to
 - I will create parent awareness programmes, where parents who are struggling to connect with their teenagers can come and learn how to support young people as they grow as individuals.

- 3. As a Youth MP, one of my main focuses would be sexual assault prevention in Camden.**
 - I am aware that this issue is incredibly hard to solve, as each case is unique. However, if I am voted Youth MP, I will aim to prevent as many cases of sexual assault as possible
 - I will promote social norms that protect against violence, such as bystander approaches and mobilising men as allies
 - Sex and relationships education classes in Camden schools will teach social-emotional learning, healthy, safe dating relationship skills and will provide empowerment-based training
 - I will also create protective environments by improving safety and monitoring in schools, establishing and consistently applying workplace policies and addressing community-level risks through environmental approaches.

- 4. As a Youth MP, I would support local work to tackle climate change by helping to make our borough more eco-friendly.**
 - Schools in Camden will be educated on exactly what staff, pupils and their families can do to reduce carbon emissions. Examples of these include the reduction of car idling and greater use of food recycling caddies.
